

Comment from the Mayor...

Local government's highest calling

Local government's highest calling is to provide the 'bread and butter' services which touch our lives on a daily basis: police and fire protection, streets, parks and libraries. These services keep us safe while

enhancing the quality of our lives.

Over the past several years Youngtown Town Council and staff have worked diligently to complete major, decades overdue, infrastructure improvements while winning millions of dollars in grants to finance them:

* Street lights have

now been installed in virtually every neighborhood in town.

* Nearly eight miles of alleys have now been paved, bringing Youngtown into compliance with Maricopa County's 5 percent reduction plan for PM 10 emissions.

* All four phases of the fire-flow project have been completed bringing the entire town up to international fire code standards and enhancing fire safety through quick access to fire hydrants and water with which to fight fires.

* A plan has been developed and partially funded to eliminate the stop sign and dog-leg intersection at Peoria and 115th avenues and replace them with a sweeping curve entering the Agua Fria Ranch subdivision from the north. This will al-

low quicker access and response by first responders and emergency vehicles.

* The older section of Peoria Avenue, from 111th Avenue to 115th Avenue has been completely rebuilt and upgraded to better handle the heavy traffic flow in and out of Agua Fria Ranch. This rebuild was also engineered to better handle water runoff during heavy rain.

These improvements are all being done on a pay-as-you-go basis; the town has neither incurred debt nor increased taxes in order to finance them. While doing all this we have reduced operational expenses by one-third while building a surplus, or rainy day fund, of over 60 percent of annual

expenditures. Prudent outsourcing of services, such as the recent contract with Maricopa County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) for policing, will allow the Town to continue to improve its fiscal condition while simultaneously enhancing those services.

The next couple of years will be critical for Youngtown as we continue to make fundamental decisions about the Town's sustainability while creating a pathway to enhanced economic development. There will be lots of opportunities for citizen input and involvement in this process. We're looking to you, the citizens, to help us create and sustain a bright and vibrant future for your town.

He has been the Code Enforcement Officer working with residents, business owners and volunteers to educate residents and control unkept properties. He stepped up to a new challenge without a negative comment and he was great!

Town fire hydrant project is almost done

Well, we are almost there. The last two months have been challenging to say the least.

From not being able to locate the existing water mains, to "finding" other unmarked utilities with the backhoe (something you never want to do), to not being able to do a complete shutdown when cutting into old pipes, we are almost done.

We still are in the process of pressure testing the new piping, chlorinating the new piping and then flushing the system and getting the bacteria testing from the labs before we can remove the plates, backfill and repave the streets. Dare I say the hard part is done? Knock on wood, we are almost done.

Thanks to everyone for their patience with some minor inconveniences



with water shutoffs and barricades. It WILL be worth it in the end.

The Fire Flow Upgrade Project is coming to an end. Phase 1 consisted of adding nine new fire hydrants and about 3,900 lineal feet of new waterline "pipe" underground. The town would like to thank its residents for their patients in the completion of Phases 2, 3, and 4, which were done all at once.





From the Bench...

United States prison advantages

Having traveled overseas many times, I have had opportunities to see other judicial systems. The last thing I or anyone ever wants to do while traveling abroad is to run afoul of the laws in foreign countries. Thankfully, I was only a guest when visiting Thai and Russian courts and prisons.

Clearly, the conditions run from harsh to absolutely deplorable depending where you are in the world. If it were possible for the United States to contract with third world countries to incarcerate and house our inmates, there, no doubt, would be a plunge in the rates of crime and recidivism.

I made interesting notes while in a Thai prison in Bangkok.

There are no newspapers, magazines, radios, or TV's. The food served consists mainly of soups and vegetables. Everything is militaristic and rigid, with inmates moving in perfect lines and guards carrying split bamboo whips....and they use them.

Exercise consists of calisthenics on a concrete slab. Inmates make furniture and learn sewing trades for when they are released. Penalties for violating

even minor rules can be immediate and quite harsh. Corporal punishment is common, and being hit with a bamboo whip will get anyone's attention. If an inmate attempts an escape or rapes another prisoner...they are executed.

While the Thai jails were very clean, their Russian counterparts are the opposite. Seeing the despair and hopelessness of the situation these inmates find themselves in, is gut wrenching.

Although I am not an expert on prison facilities by any stretch of the imagination, I have seen enough US prisons to know that inmates here are afforded amenities that most third world citizens (not inmates) would

consider luxurious.

Thankfully, I was a guest of the aforementioned government(s) and only an observer, but I have to say that walking out those big steel prison doors was one of the best parts of the experience.



Dogs on the loose not the stray...



People tend to think that packs of dogs running loose and attacking humans and domestic animals are "wild" or strays, and probably not "every day" loving pets. In fact, more likely than not, these dog packs are pets that have escaped their homes or have been let out by the owners to explore our Town. When dogs team up into packs, they tend to revert to their basic instincts which include hunting down and killing things. People are no exception to them, even though at home, they are probably totally trustworthy and would never show any sign of viciousness. While I'd love

to recommend that people try to avoid this habit of letting their dogs out the door with neither supervision nor restraint, we all know that would be as likely as ridding the world of irresponsible pet owners. We can all dream, can't we?

While properly-done dog ownership is a virtual problem free relationship, when there are problems, they can be severe. A dog off its leash at minimum is a nuisance and can lead to a citation. When a dog causes injuries or death, the owner can be charged with criminal negligence and other crimes. To avoid this prob-

lem, make sure pens are secure, fences are dig and jump-proof, and if your dog does manage to escape, make sure to notify animal control and neighbors so they can start looking for your pet.

The following is some basic information that every resident should know about pet ownership in the Town of Youngtown:

DOGS: See a loose dog, report it,

From 10 garding dogs and cats.

- Dogs four months and older must be vaccinated against rabies and licensed annually as proof of rabies vaccination.

- Dogs may not be loose unless they are being used for livestock control or hunting.

- Dogs outside of the residence must be in a suitable enclosure or confined on a leash no longer than six feet in length.

- It is unlawful for dog owners to harbor a dog that barks or howls on a consistent basis and disturbs the peace of neighbors.

Cats are considered “free

roaming” animals by law, which makes responsible pet ownership even more important.

To report a Loose or Non-Registered Dog (known owner) go to www.maricopa.gov and go to Enforcement Services and Laws to complete form. You may also go to this web address to receive information on any animal control questions you may have.


