A Youngtown Winter Miracle at Greer Park

The Youngtown Winter Miracle event is Dec. 8, from 5 to 8 p.m. The Town of Youngtown has been notified that Santa will arrive at 6 p.m. He will be escorted to Greer Park on a fire truck.

This has become a much anticipated event for the residents of Youngtown as well as families from surrounding communities. This year, the Town will host its first Tree Lighting

Ceremony 6 p.m. at Clubhouse Square to kick off the holidays. "Snow" will fall in the play area (10 tons) and a bouncy house will be in place for those who wish to take a break from the snow. The

"Santa Express" trackless train will be taking young passengers to see the holiday decorations around Clubhouse Square and Greer Park.

Featured entertainment will include the

Compass Bible Church Youth Band and carolers. Last year, the Town had approximately 1,000 people in a three hour event, serving them hot chocolate, cookies, and candy canes. Food and

drinks will be available for sale. This year, we anticipate an attendance of around 1,200, so bundle up and come join us for an old-fashion celebration.

In the recent general election, Youngtown voters showed overwhelming support for Proposition 453 - a permanent base adjustment to the Town's expenditure

limitation. In an election which saw a heavy turnout of nearly 68 percent (2,366 registered voters with 1,604 ballots cast), 73.94 percent of those who cast a vote on Prop 453 voted in favor of it. We, at Town Hall, were careful to explain the purpose and ramifications of Prop. 453 along with the positive

impact it would have on the Town's future.

During this administration's tenure, the past six years, we have implemented some of the most profound changes in the Town's history. We have managed to complete massive infrastructure improvements, overhauled much of the Town's founda-


tional policies, drastically reduced operational expenditures, while greatly improving service deliverables and simultaneously built a serious rainy-day fund. We have always tried to be as forthright and transparent as possible - offering you, the citizens, every opportunity to question, discuss and ultimately understand our vision for the Town along with the policy decisions we were making to shape its future and to tell us whether or not you sup-

ported the policies we were pursuing.

I want to personally thank you for your attentiveness and your support these past six years. Youngtown is a great place to live; a place where citizens can raise their families while living their lives in quiet and safe enjoyment. From the Clerks Office...

The Maricopa County Elections Department has our election results - finally.

The Town of Youngtown sought voters' approval to permanently adjust the expenditure base of the Town as determined by the Economic Estimates Commission. The Permanent Base Adjustment (Proposition 453) was successfully approved by Youngtown voters with:

Yes vote: 922, 73.94%
No vote: 325, 26.06%

Total votes: 1,247

What does this mean for the Town of Youngtown? In 2013-2014 the Town's expenditure limitation will increase by \$4,662,526, from \$4,662,526 to \$9,325,053. The Town will utilize the additional expenditure authority for all local budgetary purposes. Funding will come from revenue obtained from federal, state, and local sources. The approval of Proposition 453 will not impose or authorize a tax increase.

Illegal yard sale signage

With the Fall yard sale season in full swing, Code Enforcement would like to remind and educate residents that it is illegal, under Town code, to place signs in the right-of-way of all public roads, which include signs placed on traffic signs, street lamps, electrical poles, utility boxes, etc. Property owners are allowed "carport sale"

or similarly worded signs on a self-supporting stake or pole (wood, metal, etc.) and not more than 24 inches in height, measured from the ground upward to the top of the sign on their own private property.

Signs posted in the right-of-way pose a safety problem for drivers and pedestrians by distracting motorists and creating blind spots. Furthermore, most of these signs are

never removed and quickly litter the streets detracting from the appearance of our neighborhoods.

To stay safe and protect the community, residents are encouraged to place their yard or garage sale signs on private property. Better yet, we urge residents to announce their yard and garage sales in local newspapers via classified ads or free website listings.

The Code Enforcement Officer will remove any signs placed illegally in the public right-of-way. Notice of Violations or Citations may be given on any violations. Please note, a person violating any of the provisions of this chapter is guilty of a class 1 misdemeanor and upon conviction may be subject to a fine of up to \$2,500 and/or six months in the Maricopa County Jail. Visit the website, www.youngtownaz.org, for a complete list of codes.

Q & A:

Is there a limit on the number of garage sales I can have?

Garage sales are limited to four times in a calendar



year for a maximum of three consecutive days in any 30 day period. This limitation applies to the location of the garage sale.

Do I need a permit to have a garage sale?

No. Permits are not required for garage sales. They will be regulated through a computer tracking process.

Do I need to remove all unsold items from my property?

No. All unsold items do not need to be removed from property, but all items/articles must be removed from public view at all times.



It is unlawful to place garage sale signs in any manner upon rights-of-ways, including utility poles, stop signs, etc. Persons placing signs on public rights-of-way shall be subject to the issuance of a Citation.



From the Bench...Freedom

As with any U.S. citizen here in our country, there are some things I don't like about our government or how it is run. On occasion, I see people on the streets carrying signs or on TV protesting their grievances or issues. I consider many of these individuals as extremists or dismiss as inconsequential to anything I am interested in, but in the back of my mind I always remember the principals this

country was founded on. The right to assemble and have free speech is a precious one that we often take for granted because we have always enjoyed that inalienable right.

My appreciation for our right to free speech is often reinforced with what I see in other countries around the world and with those that are called dissidents or enemies of the state within their own homelands.

When I travel overseas, the rights that I enjoy here stay here. For my own safety and respect for the rules of the nations I visit, I become non-political.

In Russia and the former Eastern Bloc countries, political freedom and tolerance has changed for the better, but protesting for political reform can still draw you a jail term or even make you "disappear."

Not long ago, I was a guest of the Chief Justice (and top Communist party leader) in Vietnam. During that trip, and according to the U.S. Embassy staff that accompanied me, I was the first American permitted to enter and see the Vietnamese court system since the Communist Party took over in mid 1970's.

During this visit, there was a trial in progress that I was permitted to observe. Approximately 15 or so individuals were chained together in the court room. The proceedings were being

broadcast outside and around the entire Capitol city which I soon understood why...

The defendants in this trial were not murders, rapists, or thieves, but were being tried for "Crimes against the State" (Vietnam). They were political dissidents that had spoken against the communist regime and were now facing the consequences for their attempt of speech we so freely enjoy here in the USA.

I asked the Chief Justice thru the interpreter about the proceedings. He stated that as soon as the trial was

over, the dissidents will be executed. My mind was reeling, the outcome and punishment was predetermined and the defendants will "and did" pay the ultimate penalty for what we have as a protected right by constitution.

This is a small sampling of consequences that political speech will bring in many countries around the world. Our country, as imperfect as we may be, is still the bastion of freedom and opportunity that is often taken for granted, but quickly appreciated when traveling internationally.

On Nov. 15, the Town Council took final public and professional input concerning the waterfowl at Maricopa Lake. It is their official directive that the public be educated to NOT FEED WILDLIFE including all species of geese, ducks, pigeons, and other waterfowl.

- Pollution of the lake (larger numbers upset the lake's ecology causing poor water quality).
- Overpopulation (duck feces, ducks crossing streets, and nesting in

waterfowl) is enjoyable for all ages as they eagerly gather for a feeding. But, there is a problem that makes it necessary to take certain actions to reduce the waterfowl population. Signs soon will be going up requesting voluntary public action. If this step does not produce the expected positive results, then stronger, legal actions may be necessary to consider.



Successful engagement: a one year milestone for Town of Youngtown and Maricopa County Sheriff's Department

On Dec.1, 2011, the Youngtown Council voted unanimously to contract with MCSO for the Town's policing services. It was an astounding, difficult decision, and not one taken lightly following almost three hours of emotional public input.

In the beginning of this process, it quickly became apparent that each phasing step to a contract policing service had to be methodical, precise, dependent on legal resources, and a dedicated group of people to properly

and respectfully disassemble the Youngtown Police Department. There were no manuals, instructions, or seasoned experience to draw upon for this astounding process.

Public Safety Manager Mike Kessler (former Youngtown Police Sgt.) took command and forged ahead compiling one successful step after another.

Each quarter Town Manager Lloyce Robinson has provided a report to the Council and public outlining the progress, challenge, and cau-

tious steps taken to move full responsibility of all operations from the former Youngtown Police Department and to phase out an enormous inventory of equipment, resources, open cases, and sensitive records.

First quarter ending February 2012 reported separation agreements, final employee compensation, increase in Court activity (53 to 356-comparison to prior year, same period), transferring 37 open cases to MCSO and the Transition Team challenges.

Success was defined by: positive public acceptance, Town liability virtually non-existent, cost savings, and greater diversity/level of service, and formation of the Transition Team.

Second quarter ending May 2012 reflected a change to the original MCSO contract as negotiations to transfer equipment/vehicles to MCSO decreasing the contract cost of capital improvements by just under \$100,000. Court activity increased (133 to 698) compared to prior year,

same period. Success was defined by: facility areas reassigned (former Police Building divided into Emergency Operations Center, MCSO deputy office, Code Enforcement offices, and renamed Public Safety Building); large inventory of guns, cameras, radar equipment etc. categorized then sold to other policing agencies; and financial savings.

Third quarter ending August 2012 echoes the prior quarters as successful with an estimated savings of more

than \$200,000. Court activity comparison: 215 increased to 1,100. Success was defined by: Action Plan completions of the Facility Team, Investigations, and Property & Evidence missions; disbursement of equipment inventory 90 percent complete, Transition Team phasing out duties, and YT/MCSO Management monthly meetings continue ensuring ongoing communication.

Fourth quarter/annual report will be presented at the Jan. 17 Council Meeting.


