ACCEPTED

- Cut tree limbs into 4-foot segments.
- Tree limbs and other objects must be less than 12 inches in diameter.
- Wood panels and wood fencing must be no larger than 4 feet square.
- Place yard clippings (grass, leaves, palm tree skins and bark) in plastic bags. Bags must be securely tied.
- Place cacti in small, sturdy cardboard boxes. Boxes should be 2'x2'x2' or smaller.

NOT ACCEPTED

- NO oil, paint, car batteries, pool chemicals or any hazardous materials. Included but not limited to: Antifreeze and automotive products, including car batteries, vehicle tires, oil and filters, Flammables, Mercury, Oil-based paint, Pesticides, Propane tanks, gasoline.
- NO dirt, rock, gravel, concrete, shingles, bricks, dry wall, blocks, tile, wet or dry mortar, sod, bunny ears or polka dot cactus (Opuntia) or other unacceptable items.

The Town will not be conducting alley or curbside pick ups this 2013 season.

Comment from the Mayor...The triumph of evil

Can anyone doubt the existence of evil in the world? If you're not convinced by the horrific actions of the murderer in Newtown, Conn. two weeks ago, then look back in modern history: the Rwandan genocide of a half-million people in 1994, while the U.N. and the world stood by; Pol Pot, the Cambodian dictator, whose brutal

policies killed as many as 3 million of his own people in the late 1970s; Adolph Hitler, whose racially motivated hatred led to the extermination of 11 million Jews and "non-Aryans" during World War II; or how about the 2,400 shootings and 500-plus gun-related homicides in the City of Chicago this past year - in spite of the toughest gun control laws in the country. Attributing these evil acts to the caprices of madmen is inadequate, even counter-productive.

These murderers are evil; they wear many faces; their evil manifests itself in many places: movie theatres, military bases, shopping malls, grade schools, porch steps and neighborhood streets - all places where innocents going about their daily lives have been terrorized and murdered by evil men in America. "The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for good men to do nothing." This quote, attributed to Edmund Burke, the 18th century

political philosopher, is probably a paraphrase of his belief that "...When bad men combine, the good must associate; else they will fall, one by one, an unpitied sacrifice in a contemptible struggle..." Yet, good men associating in response to evil is, in and of itself, inadequate unless their responses are measured, appropriate and effective. Government, by itself, is incapable of defeating this kind of evil. Without citizen vigilance and personal responsibility, government can exac-

erbate and embolden evil - making it more virulent. We, as citizens, had better hold our leaders accountable for their responsive actions in combating this evil: making sure that their responses are measured, appropriate and effective - not just a barrage of knee-jerk laws, policies and platitudes, which, in the end, only tighten the "circle of freedom," making it more difficult for the good people to associate and fight evil wherever and whenever it manifests itself.

Financial Awareness – November 2012 Overview

In an effort to increase public awareness of “where the Town gets its money to operate,” the graph on the right has been created, which is the same information provided to the Town Council each month regarding Revenue. A more detailed monthly financial report reflects all expenditures in all funds.

The below graph compares revenues for last year (Budget 2011-12) and current year (Budget 2012-13) highlighting some of the larger revenue resources. HURF (Highway

Users Revenue Fund) is a restricted fund and may be used only for transit projects, i.e. street repair/projects. The other listed revenue comprises the major funding sources that operate the General Fund or Town operations, i.e., salaries, insurance premiums, materials/supplies, fuel, repairs, etc.

Each proposed budget is an estimation of expected revenue and expenditures based on prior revenues/State distribution and a five year plan.

**The Monthly Target column is a tool to monitor expenditures. If the estimated revenue decreases then expenditures must decrease.*

GRAFFITI

Youngtown Municipal Code Sec.9.08.111. A.2: Graffiti constitutes a public nuisance and a threat to public safety which must be abated to alleviate the detrimental impact of such graffiti on the town, and to prevent the further spread of graffiti; 3. Certain categories of graffiti, which incite violence, are especially harmful and must be removed as quickly as possible to avoid or minimize harm to persons and the whole community.

The Town of Youngtown believes that the existence of graffiti is damaging to property values, negatively affects quality of life and discredits the Town's reputation for livability. When graffiti remains on our properties, it invites yet more graffiti and leads to an

increase of vandalism and other criminal activity. Immediate graffiti removal is key to controlling and eradicating graffiti.

The Maricopa County Attorney's Office has employed various investigative techniques, including hidden cameras, to catch graffiti vandals in the act. Convicted graffiti vandals can receive over three years in prison, loss of their driver's license or ability to get a license until they are 18, and can be ordered to pay full restitution to victims. Additionally, courts may impose fines up to \$150,000, and a minor vandal's parents may be held liable up to \$10,000.

Please take an active part in your community by contacting Code Enforcement at 623-933-8286 to report graffiti or if you see graffiti taking place contact the Maricopa County Sheriff's Office immediately at 602-876-1011.

Please Do Not Feed

On November 15, 2012 the Town Council took final public and professional input concerning the waterfowl at Maricopa Lake. It is their official directive that the public be educated to NOT FEED WILDLIFE including all species of geese, ducks, pigeons and other waterfowl.

Feeding these animals is proven to cause:

- Pollution of the Lake (larger numbers upset the Lake's ecology causing poor water quality)
- Overpopulation (duck

feces, ducks crossing streets and nesting in neighboring yards)

- Unnatural/unacceptable wildlife behavior (migratory fowl remain and don't follow natural behavior)

The serenity of ducks floating on the Lake creates a picturesque experience. Tossing bread (which is not nutritionally balanced for waterfowl) is enjoyable for all ages as they eagerly gather for a feeding. BUT there is a problem that makes it necessary to take certain actions to reduce the



waterfowl population.

Signs soon will be going up requesting voluntary public action. If this step does not produce the expected positive results, then stronger, legal actions may be necessary to consider.

Youngtown residents are asked to give their full support and cooperation to NOT FEED THE GEESE, DUCKS, AND PIGEONS.

From the Bench...

Bad luck, but should try the Lotto

I suppose many of you have heard the urban legend about the burglar who injures himself while burglarizing a home, and sues the homeowner for the inadequate lighting that caused him to trip.

While the case you read here may not be quite as brazen, it does make you question the thought process some people have.

Maricopa County once received a "Notice of Claim" from a personal injury lawyer representing a client who is a non U.S. citizen. This is the type of "notice" that is a required precursor to filing a lawsuit against any governmental agency. The notice gives the government an opportunity to review a claim for damages and offer a settlement or deny the claim prior to a costly lawsuit, if any.

The case of the individual referred here to as the "claimant" is as follows. Since December of this same year the claimant "who was in the United States illegally" was driving Westbound on US 60 when a vehicle that he was

towing disconnected and wrecked on the highway.

The Arizona Department of Public Safety (DPS) responded to the scene and took control of the site and subsequent investigation. During the investigation, the police asked the claimant his name and to produce the standard legal documents regarding insurance and registration.

Unknown to the officer, the claimant gave the police a completely false name coupled with a bogus date of birth. The officer proceeded to run a record check of the name and DOB and found an outstanding felony arrest warrant for a homicide suspect out of San Diego, California. In other words,

the claimant had some seriously bad luck when making up a name and DOB because it coincidentally matched a suspect with the name and similar physical characteristics.

The claimant was arrested and transported to the County Jail where he was fingerprinted and booked into jail on the outstanding warrant.

By now, the claimant is giving a different name to the jail booking personnel, supposedly his real one this time.

In the notice filed with the lawyer for the claimant, he wrote, the reason he gave a falsified name to the police was because of his "cultural fear" of police in his native third world country.

Three weeks later the claimant's true identity was established and he was released from jail. Now the claimant wants the Arizona taxpayers to give him \$500,000 for the inconvenience despite the facts that he was in the U.S. illegally, driving with no license, no insurance, caused a major accident and in an attempt to

hide his identity and avoid responsibility gave a false name and DOB to the police which resulted in his arrest and booking.

What makes this case unusual is that it's the exception, rather than the norm. I only hope that the Risk Management Officer that reviews these types of claims will flat out reject it.
