Comment from the Mayor...

Your Safety: the Prime-Directive

Over the years, I've learned that the most important function I can perform, as your Mayor, is to constantly look for ways to make Youngtown a safer community. Part and parcel of that is configuring the community in ways which allow first responder vehicles like fire trucks, ambulances and law enforcement vehicles to get into and out of neighborhoods as quickly as possible. Parking violations like parking too close to fire hydrants and intersections or in other no parking zones can lengthen fire and police response times and threaten first responders' ability to respond to emergencies in a timely manner.

As part of the process of developing a Code Compliance Strategic Plan for dealing with parking violations, the Town Council created a Parking Committee, chaired by me, to study the most egregious

parking violations. This committee has presented a series of recommendations to the Town Council and a timeline for their implementation. These recommendations are being implemented in phases with the first phase focusing on Agua Fria Ranch and the enforcement of laws that already exist in Town code and/or state statute.

For example, residents are prohibited from parking in fire lanes or other areas designated no-parking by the Town Code. See Town Code §§ 10.16.040, .050, and .055. Residents are prohibited by state law from parking within fifteen feet of a fire hydrant See A.R.S. § 28-873(A)(4). Residents are prohibited from parking within thirty feet on the approach to any flashing beacon, stop sign, yield sign, or traffic control signal located at the side of a roadway. See A.R.S. § 28-873(A)(7).

The Town Council has directed staff to begin enforcing these regulations. We are in the process of painting curbs in front of fire hydrants and on the approach to stop signs in

order to designate these areas as no-parking zones and help raise awareness. Once these areas have been designated as no parking zones, we will begin citing for violations.

The Town wants to assure you that your concerns are important. Working together, we can make Youngtown a safer and better community. The Town shares this goal with the Agua Fria Ranch Home Owners' Association (HOA). Although the Town does not enforce the HOA's Conditions, Covenants and Regulations (CC&Rs), we will be working, in cooperation with the HOA, to assure maximum safety on our streets. 



Virginia Elliott remembered as Builder of Youngtown

Longtime resident of Youngtown, Virginia May (Owens) Elliott, passed away Saturday, May 27, 2017. She and her husband, Robert, owned Elliott Construction Company, which built over 800 of the first houses in Youngtown.

Virginia was born March 30, 1920, and married Robert P. Elliott in 1938. They lived on a farm 100 miles east of Kansas City, Missouri and moved to Arizona in 1947. In 1955, Robert

purchased a set of four books on how to build a house, and he submitted a bid to the Youngtown Land and Development Company and won the bid. Virginia worked in the office and assisted buyers with the “add-ons” and she would take orders out to the workers on the job. Sometimes the extras were more than the cost of the house.

Youngtown was originally a senior community and they lived in the Rovey Farms area of Glendale,

as they weren’t old enough to live in Youngtown. Their daughter, Virginia Rose, married Charlie Smith in 1957 at the Youngtown Methodist Church, the first church in Youngtown. Their wedding was the first wedding at the church, when it was just a sanctuary with folding chairs, and their reception was in the Youngtown Clubhouse. Robert passed away in 1971 and Virginia later moved to Youngtown where she spent the rest of her life.

I was thrown over the fence at the Youngtown Dog Park – tossed away like trash. Perhaps I was not a good dog, barked a lot or caused some trouble – I didn’t know, but I was very scared and did not understand why I was abandoned. At least I was in an area, sort of protected; and I could sense that other dogs and humans had been in the park.

I was rescued after some time by a very sweet couple. These people noticed I was dirty and had a limp. They took me to the Vet and I went home with them, with a cast on my leg, result of perhaps being tossed over the fence, which caused my broken leg! Now I am loved and really cared for and appreciated, and I have been on my best behavior.

Please don’t abandon other dogs in the Dog Park or just let them wander the area. They may not be as fortunate as me. There are many facilities that will take in your dog if you are no longer able to care for them properly. Nearly every breed has a rescue organization that can help assist with relocation. Thank you for reading my story.

Pet owners have noticed a lot of dog waste not being picked up. On their own they pick up after others so the Park can stay free of disease and odor. Pet waste bags are always available and the Town

Fireworks Safety Tips from the Maricopa County Sheriff's Office

We have already hit 100 degrees and summer has not arrived, that means we need to stay hydrated and cool to avoid heat-related illnesses while we are enjoying our great Sonoran climate. Unfortunately, the heat, when combined with our dry conditions, also raises the risk of fire. Stay aware of potential sources of ignition and combustible fuels and keep them away from each other.

Of course, we all know about the dangers of our summer season, but too often we forget to be proactive. For instance, let's talk about the danger of fireworks in Youngtown. Using fireworks, even legally, can provide an ignition source for a blazing fire, which could consume residential structures or dry vegetation. No one can argue that either could present a threat to human life and safety, property, or our desert wildlife and plants.

Here are some safety

tips to consider from the National Council on Fireworks Safety, if you do choose to make fireworks a part of your summer celebrations:

- Know and obey State and Town laws regarding the use of fireworks; you can find Town Code 9.04.010 – Firearms and Explosives online at YoungtownAZ.org.

- Use only legal fireworks; read the cautionary labels and performance descriptions before igniting them.

- Only a responsible adult SHOULD supervise all firework activities.

- Never give fireworks to children.

- Never carry fireworks in your POCKET or shoot them into METAL or GLASS containers.

- Wear safety glasses when handling or igniting fireworks.

- Light one firework at a time and then move away quickly.

- Use fireworks OUTDOORS ONLY, in

a clear area; away from buildings, vehicles or any other fuel source.

- Alcohol and fireworks do not mix.

- Never relight a "dud" firework. Wait 20 minutes and then soak it in a bucket of water.

- Always have a bucket of water and charged water hose nearby.

For your pets:

- Don't bring your pets to a fireworks display, even a small one.

- If fireworks are being used near your home, put your pet in a safe, interior room to avoid exposure to the sound.

- Make sure your pet has an identification tag, in case it runs off during a fireworks display.

- Never shoot fireworks of any kind (consumer fireworks, sparklers, fountains, etc.) near pets.

Please remember to be safe and you will always have a fun celebration.

In the Works... Town of Youngtown Cleaning Position: Part-Time

The Town of Youngtown is seeking a part-time cleaning position for the Town facilities. This position reports to the Public Works Manager.

Duties:

- Vacuum carpets
- Vacuum walk-off mats
- Spot clean Carpet, i.e.: spills
- Dust and mop floors
- Dust furniture
- Clean restrooms: refill supply dispensers, clean and disinfect restroom fixtures, clean mirrors, clean counters, clean faucets and other fixtures, clean/disinfect toilets/urinals, refill odor misters
- Clean and polish drinking fountain(s)
- Clean inside and outside of front doors
- Dust all horizontal surfaces within reach
- Damp wipe horizontal surfaces with appropriate cleaner
- Dust and damp wipe windowsills
- Spot clean all walls, light switches and doors
- Spot clean partition glass
- Empty and remove trash cans, replace liners as necessary
- Empty recycle containers – take to designated area
- Empty paper shredder as necessary
- Pour water and enzyme odor remover in floor drains
- Wash windows, inside and out, for all buildings
- Clean Clubhouse kitchen cabinets, stove, and refrigerator twice a year
- Carpet cleaning and spot removal: as needed in each building.
- Clean park restrooms bi-weekly
